Plant Profile:


Lime Lovers

If you are fortunate enough to own Baldassare Mineo's book, "Rock Garden Plants A Color Encyclopedia", you will find on page 266 a list of plants for limy soil. This might be the place to start looking for plants to put in your tufa or hypertufa garden.

From Acantholimon to *Viola delphinantha* the list is great fun to read and the perfect place to start your research to find plants that might be hardy here.

I have a list marked in blue highlighter in my book here are some favorites: Androsace chamaejasme, Companula cochlearifolia, Campanula garganica, Campanula portenschlagiana (These are all very small in spite of their big names). There are Drabas, Dryas, Gypsophila, Kelsia uniflora, Leontopodium, Primula auricula, Primula marginata, Saxifragas, and a long list of Silene.
