Mt. Healy Expeditions

The Alaska Rock Garden Society will be making two trips to Mt. Healy this year. One in June to view the flowers and plants and one in August to collect seeds. This is a wonderful opportunity to see some of the most choice native rock garden plants in their natural habitat. Verna Pratt will lead the expedition. Don't miss this one!

This area is extremely rich in desirable plants. In addition to the many alpines you would expect to find, choice plants such as *Rhododendron laponicum*, *Eritrichiums*, *Artimesia globularia*, *Androsace chamae-jasme*, *and Douglasia gormani*, have also been spotted in the area. This is a trip you will want to put on your calendar. Rock gardeners from around the world would love to have the opportunity to see these little charmers in their native habitat. If you are interested, call Verna at 333-8212 so that she knows who to expect and doesn't leave anyone behind. Verna also has information on housing opportunities in the area and ride and room share possibilities.

Saturday, June12th intrepid rock gardeners will meet at the Antler Creek Parking Lot (Mile 245.1 Parks Hwy. left side) at 9:00 a.m. We will be joining Verna Pratt for a day of exploring and viewing flowers on Mt. Healy by way of Antler Creek.

Sunday, June 13th will find the same group hiking the Savage River Trail in Denali Park to view the flowers there.

The August 7th and 8th trip will be in the same area to collect seeds from the specimens viewed in June.
